## **SERVICE NOTES FOR THIS SUNDAY**

During our Easter vigil, we mark the transition from Lent, a season of repentance, to Easter, a day of celebration. This service is almost a reversal of a Good Friday Tenebrae service as Jesus "passes over" from death to life. You'll notice a gradual lightening of the sanctuary and the introduction of celebratory elements. White is the color of the Easter season, because it reminds of Jesus' pure sacrifice. And that, because of His sacrifice, our sins are washed white as snow.

## INVITATION

Leader Beloved in the Lord, on this most holy night, in which our Lord Jesus passed over from death to life, we are gathered to worship in the name of the LORD: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

**People This is the Passover of our Lord. By hearing His Word and celebrating His Supper, we share in His victory over death.**

Leader Let us pray.

O God, You are like a refiner's fire, and Your Spirit enkindles the hearts of Your faithful people with the fire of Your love. Bless, we implore You, this new flame and those who keep this joyful Easter festival that, burning with desire for life with You, we may be found rightly prepared to share in the Feast of Light which has no end; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

**People Amen.**

*(Sit)*

*Our confession of sins today is rooted in the master narrative Scripture, highlighting a few key points in the story leading to Easter. The lights remain off as we await the resurrection of Jesus.*

## CONFESSION

Leader We hear the story of God's restoring and reconciling presence in His world and His people:

Leader In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was formless and empty, and darkness covered the deep waters. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the surface of the waters. *Genesis 1:1-2 (NLT)*

**People Creator God, we recognize the darkness of sin in our hearts. Send, we pray, Your Spirit to move within us. As You spoke light into existence in Your world, so speak light into our hearts, driving out the darkness.**

*Silence for personal confession.*

Leader Give these instructions to the family of Jacob; announce it to the descendants of Israel: "You have seen what I did to the Egyptians. You know how I carried you on eagles' wings and brought you to Myself. Now if you will obey Me and keep My covenant, you will be My own special treasure from among all the peoples on earth; for all the earth belongs to Me. And you will be My kingdom of priests, My holy nation." Exodus 19:3-6 (NLT)

**People Redeemer God, ransom our captive souls, release us from slavery to sin; let our hearts and minds be held by You alone.**

*Silence for personal confession.*

Leader And because Joseph was a descendant of King David, he had to go to Bethlehem in Judea, David's ancient home. He traveled there from the village of Nazareth in Galilee. He took with him Mary, to whom he was engaged, who was now expecting a child. And while they were there, the time came for her baby to be born. She gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped Him snugly in strips of cloth and laid Him in a manger, because there was no lodging available for them. *Luke 2:4-7 (NLT)*

**People Jesus, make in our hearts a holy place kept for You.**

*Silence for personal confession.*

Leader Jesus traveled through all the towns and villages of that area, teaching in the synagogues and announcing the Good News about the Kingdom. And He healed every kind of disease and illness. When He saw the crowds, He had compassion on them because they were confused and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. *Matthew 9:35-36 (NLT)*

**People Good Shepherd, care for us and teach us to listen to Your voice and follow You.**

*Silence for personal confession.*

Leader And they brought Jesus to a place called Golgotha (which means "Place of the Skull"). They offered Him wine drugged with myrrh, but He refused it. Then the soldiers nailed Him to the cross. *Mark 15:22-24 (NLT)*

**People Let us daily die with You, O Christ, and let all the things of this world to which we cling be left in the grave.**

*Silence for personal confession.*

*(Stand)*

## **ABSOLUTION**

Leader But very early on Sunday morning the women went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. They found that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance. So they went in, but they didn't find the body of the Lord Jesus. As they stood there puzzled, two men suddenly appeared to them, clothed in dazzling robes. The women were terrified and bowed with their faces to the ground. Then the men asked, "Why are you looking among the dead for someone who is alive? He isn't here! He is risen from the dead!" *Luke 24:1-6 (NLT)*

**People Risen Christ, we believe that even as You were raised from the dead by God's power, we, too, will rise in You. Until that day, make us new each day that we might be Your living presence in our dying world.**

Leader Hear the Good News: In Christ, God has filled us with light and released us from bondage. He has forgiven our sins for Jesus' sake.

**People Amen.**

Leader He is risen!

**People He is risen indeed! Alleluia!**

*With the forgiveness of sins, you'll notice some changes. The slides change from black and white to color, the tomb is now open, and life springs forth. The lights begin to come on as well, signifying the resurrection of Jesus is here!*

*Exsultet means "rejoice" in Latin. This is the great Easter Proclamation in the Vigil and gets its name from the Latin text that begins "Exsultet iam angelica turba caelorum", which means "Now let the angelic host rejoice." This prayer dates back to at least the 7th century, possibly written by St. Ambrose in the late 300s.*

## EXSULTET

**Leader** Rejoice now, all you heav'nly choirs of angels; rejoice now, all creation; sound forth, trumpet of salvation, and proclaim the triumph of our King. Rejoice too, all the earth, in the radiance of the light now poured upon you and made brilliant by the brightness of the everlasting King; know that the ancient darkness has been forever banished. Rejoice, O Church of Christ, clothed in the brightness of this light; let all this house of God ring out with rejoicing, with the praises of all God's faithful people.

On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wine, of rich food full of marrow, of aged wine well refined. And he will swallow up on this mountain the covering that is cast over all peoples, the veil that is spread over all nations. He will swallow up death forever; and the Lord God will wipe away tears from all faces, and the reproach of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken. It will be said on that day, "Behold, this is our God; we have waited for him, that he might save us. his is the Lord; we have waited for him; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation."

**People** **Thanks be to God.**

Reader God speaks to us through the New Testament: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

**People Glory to You, O Lord.**

Reader When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?" And looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back—it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe, and they were alarmed. **NICENE CREED**

**People I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.**

*Like the confession of sins today, this prayer rehearses some of the great salvation story. It begins with an abbreviated Kyrie using the simple form of "Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy." The prayer then addresses Jesus, highlighting His work on our behalf and some of the post-resurrection appearances of Jesus as we pray for His mercy. The prayer continues with a request to deliver us from death and to daily die and rise with Him as we live new lives by the power of the Holy Spirit. It concludes with a simplified text from the Agnus Dei and the Kyrie again.*

*We sing praise to God for the forgiveness of sins we just received in the absolution. "This is the Feast" is based on Revelation 5:12-13 and 19:5-9. It is typically used as the hymn of praise during the Easter season when celebrating the Lord's Supper.*

## PREPARATION FOR LORD'S SUPPER

Leader The Lord be with you.

Leader It is truly good, right, and salutary that we should at all times and in all places, with all our heart and mind and voice, praise You, O Lord, Holy Father, almighty everlasting God, and Your only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ. For He is the very Paschal Lamb who offered Himself for the sin of the world, who has cleansed us by the shedding of His precious blood. This is the night when You brought our fathers, the children of Israel, out of bondage in Egypt and led them through the Red Sea on dry ground. This is the night when all who believe in Christ are delivered from bondage to sin and are restored to life and immortality. This is the night when Christ, the Life, arose from the dead. The seal of the grave is broken and the morning of the new creation breaks forth out of night. Oh, how wonderful and beyond all telling is Your mercy toward us, O God, that to redeem a slave You gave Your Son. How holy is this night when all wickedness is put to flight and sin is washed away. How holy is this night when innocence is restored to the fallen and joy is given to those downcast. How blessed is the night when man is reconciled to God in Christ. Holy Father, accept now the evening sacrifices of our thanksgiving and praise. Let Christ, the true light and morning star, shine in our hearts, He who gives light to all creation, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

**People Amen.**

Leader Lord, remember us in Your kingdom and teach us to pray:

**People Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever and ever. Amen.**

*We welcome to the Lord's Table baptized believers who confess their sins, affirm their faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, and who accept that Christ's body and blood are truly present in Holy Communion, given for the forgiveness of sins.*
